Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father. (Gal 4:6)

Father Hansen's Message... Today is Trinity Sunday – What a great mystery we contemplate on this Sunday. On May 17th there was a Summit (on Zoom) on Catholic Education in St. Joseph. Our new ECC Director who listened in said the highlight of the Summit was Bishop Johnston's words. Although I didn't take verbatim notes, I took some. Here they are:

First Bsp. Johnston spoke of how in the Early Church (Acts of the Apostles) they argued... Discussing is good. He said we have to be humble enough:

To be open to new ideas...To listen...To allow the Spirit to help us move a vision forward...

He said education is not just education but formation, forming children to be wise and good... This is what sets us apart... we partner with parents; help form the whole person. The mind, body, heart, and spirit. To think and reason with the truth... so the children can be morally good and trustworthy. A way to engage with others making them better.

Human person is the one who takes longest to be an adult... Kids are being formed whether we like it or not ... We're about helping form them to become disciples of the Lord.

We need to be as clear as crystal what our vision is and eat, sleep, and drink it 24/7.

Does this teaching fit in with the vision? Does every coach, fit into this vision? These are question we must always ask. It takes ongoing work and leadership. Ongoing formation. All tied in with the mission of Jesus!

Later in the Summit Classical Education was brought up as a question. Bishop Johnston spoke after a brief introduction by one member of the steering committee who spoke of the *trivium* (grammar, logic, and rhetoric). The Bishop said that *Classical Education goes way back and that before the 1960's all schools taught this way. He said this also is about using the Socratic method.* The Bishop added that many may think Classical Education is weak in science or for those going into science. He said *classical education leads into science when properly understood and implemented. It is not at all, contrary to science.*

It was a great point in the Summit. Some questions came up in the chatting (on Zoom) at the Summit. I provide some links that may be of interest. All of these institutions providing the links have been highly recommended to me over the years. I'm glad to provide them and only do so given the question in the Summit but also to give maybe some background to support the Bishop's powerful words on Classical Education. This option as a possibility for the long-term vision for Catholic Schools has a long history of forming disciples. May the Trinity's mystery open us up to a vision building on the 119 years of education at the Cathedral School.
