

Bulletin Article from Father Stephen Hansen

Happy Easter!!!!!!!!!!!!!

It seems like just yesterday many of us gathered to begin Lent on Ash Wednesday. Here we are, at the point Jesus Christ rose from the dead!! When visiting the children in the Cathedral school last week, I recounted with them the great gift of the Triduum, which led up to today. Holy Thursday is where our Lord and God, Jesus Christ, instituted the Priesthood and the Eucharist. These are two unique sacraments for Catholics since the beginning of the Church and Christianity. Then I recalled Good Friday, when, at 3pm on that difficult day in the year 33 A. D., our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ seemingly took his last breath and died. Then, on Holy Saturday, one can only imagine the emotion of Mary. She was chosen to bring the savior into the world, lived an ordinary life with him for thirty years, and in about 30 A. D., he worked his first miracle at her request in Cana. Now he was seemingly dead. Today we celebrate the day our redemption was at hand. He, God, our Savior Jesus Christ, rose from the dead!!!!!!!!

I write this Easter Bulletin article from the childhood home of Charles Anthony Francis Untz in Andover, Minnesota. I learned about Charles while I was in Pre-Theology (philosophy) formation at Franciscan University of Steubenville. Charles had been accepted into the same Pre-Theology program I was in and was to attend the next year (Fall of 2000). He had been hit by a car on Monday, March 20th, and died. Charles wanted to be a priest and the Church lost a priest. Charles loved the Eucharist and would go to daily Mass at his parish when they had an early Mass (school and his job prohibited him when Mass was later in the day). On that morning, March 20th, 2000, it was the Solemnity of St. Joseph as March 19th, the normal Solemnity date, was a Sunday (and was transferred). It turns out that a parishioner saw him at Mass at the same time he was walking out of the house to go to work at a turkey farm across from his home. This was when he was hit by a car (a man went off the road as he had smoked Marijuana the day before). It appears Charles was given the grace of bilocation; he was at Mass and home at the same time. His love for the Eucharist was so great that God allowed him to be present at the later Mass when he couldn't go with his mom and brother as he normally would earlier. Now, we pray, although the Church lost a priest and an Adorer of God on earth, she gained a saint!

As we continue in these Eucharistic Revival times, let's ask for a resurrection in our love for and belief in Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist! Let us also recommit to pray for vocations to the priesthood, especially from among the young people at Our Lady of Guadalupe, St. Mary's, and the Cathedral of St. Joseph.
