A message from Father Benjamin Fenlon ...

During this Holy Week, I want to offer you some ideas to meditate and pray on, especially regarding the Passion and Death of our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ. Think, therefore, that:

- Being true God and true Man did not exempt Jesus from suffering, but rather because of it, God Himself experienced pain, humiliation, torture, and death.
- How our Lord suffered every moment consciously, offering it for the redemption of your soul, from beginning to end.
- How Jesus would willingly suffer everything again, even if you were the only one to benefit from any of it.
- How every moment of His painful and sorrowful Passion and Death was motivated by extraordinary love to you. Do not run from Jesus, or hide from Him! He has loved you so much, why hide any part of your heart from Him?
- Think how Jesus knew when you were going to be unfaithful to Him, and in those moments of your life, He chose to be faithful to you, and abundantly so. He knew that you needed His love and care to be able to recover, to come back, and He was there for you. He was there for you back then, and He will always be there for you.
- Choose one aspect of your life, of your heart, that you wish you could improve on during this Holy Week and ask our Lord that He concede you the grace to do so. Remember that He is source of all that is good, and that nothing you ask can be too great; remember that He can concede to you in one moment, what you have been unable to attain by your own efforts in decades. So ask Him with trust for grace!
- What has Jesus Christ done for you?
- What have you done for Jesus Christ?
- What will you now do for Jesus Christ?
