

#### **April is Child Abuse Prevention Awareness Month**

Did you know... Child abuse can occur in every culture and every socio-economic demographic. Peer reviewed research, especially that of the past 30 years, repeatedly shows this to be true. This same research indicates that the vast majority of child abuse occurs at the opportunities that provide access to children and may even ingratiate themselves into the home. You can protect children by respecting the safe environment protocols established at youth serving organizations. More importantly, you can implement many of these protocols in your home and be very observant and vigilant in all public/private settings.

#### Father Hansen's message . . . Happy Easter!!!!!!

People have asked me "What was the most striking experience in the Holy Land?" I've been quick to reply, approaching the Holy Sepulcher for the first time (in the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher). What was striking was meditating on the humanity of Jesus. That he took on human nature and died, and was in that tomb (that tomb being in front of you when visiting the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher). Just an amazing thing. When I go to visit family in Wisconsin, like I will on May 20<sup>th</sup> this year, I'll visit my mom and dad's tombs. I'll pray and think of great things from the past. The same can be said when we visit Saints' tombs. We think of what they stood for in their Christian life. We ask for their help. The Holy Sepulcher, on the other hand, is empty! He, God, who took on flesh like ours, is risen!!!!!!

As we go through these Easter Days, let us also consider the reality that He died and has risen so we can live forever: to redeem us! Let us also contemplate that the day He rose, Easter Sunday, Scripture (Jn 19:20-23) tells us: On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Since we started counting confessions (8/4/18), we've heard a total of over 7,000 confessions at St. Mary's and the Cathedral. That says amazing things about these two parishes. Thinking of Confession as an Easter sacrament (instituted by Jesus on Easter Sunday evening), hopefully brings you great joy when you think of the last time you went to confession and how you look forward to going again... Jesus came to redeem us and He still does every time we receive sanctifying grace from the sacraments - maybe especially from the two He instituted in Holy Week: the Eucharist and Confession.
