A message from Father Duc Nguyen

In his Lenten message for 2024, Holy Father Pope Francis reflected on the theme of freedom during the season of Lent: "When our God reveals himself, his message is always one of freedom: "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery"...Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom. Jesus himself, as we recall each year on the first Sunday of Lent, was driven into the desert by the Spirit in order to be tempted in freedom."

During Lent, we recognize that the times when we have allowed ourselves to give into temptation and have fallen into sin, are times when we have surrendered our freedom. In sin, we fall back into the slavery of our passions and unreasonableness from which God desires to free us. Sin ensnares us and limits our freedom in the spiritual realm.

Pope Francis stresses that Lent helps us to see that God desires our freedom, that he hears our yearning to freedom from the slavery of sin, and that he leads us, exclusively through Jesus Christ, out of that slavery. As standards of freedom, God gives us the Ten Commandments and the Church's moral teachings. We can live in the freedom of God's children when we obey them.

During Lent, we enter the desert with Our Lord to learn His way of freedom. The Lenten "desert," Pope Francis explains, "is the place where our freedom can mature in a personal decision not to fall back into slavery. In Lent, we find new criteria of justice and a community with which we can press forward on a road not yet taken."

Our Lenten prayer, fasting, and almsgiving all help to free us to follow Jesus more closely. Lenten prayer frees us from self-reliance. Lenten fasting frees us from disordered attachment to earthly pleasures. And Lenten almsgiving frees us from selfishness. "For this reason," the Pope says, "prayer, almsgiving and fasting are not three unrelated acts, but a single movement of openness and self-emptying, in which we cast out the idols that weigh us down, the attachments that imprison us. Then the atrophied and isolated heart will revive."

This Lenten, let us follow the Lord into the desert where He desires to free us, that we may live with hearts fully alive. . . Fr. Duc Nguyen
