#### Deacon Joshua Fultz's message . . . How to welcome the King

As we enter into the fourth Sunday in Advent, we bring to a close the time of preparation. The time has come to welcome our royal guest into our homes. This begs the question, "how should we welcome our King?" Do we bow down or kneel? Do we recite some grandiose welcome speech? What is the proper welcome for such an auspicious occasion? I believe the answer is quite simple. We welcome Him as He welcomes us with blessing and peace.

In the rat race of preparation for the Christmas season, it's easy to lose sight of both blessing and peace. Our world does not value either one and will do everything in its power to take them from you. So, as we look towards the birth of our Savior, it's a good time to keep both in mind. Christ said to his apostles, "My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled." Jesus brings us peace and blessing. During our Christmas festivities, we may be tempted towards anger or frustration because something is not going as perfectly as we have planned, but I encourage all of us to slow down and embrace Christ's peace. Look upon these events with a soft heart and love and see them as blessings. Take time to look around the room and give thanks to God for all the blessings he has given you. Then do this deacon a favor and say a little prayer for all those who are not blessed in the same way. Offer up your frustration or anger for those who do not have family or friends, those who will go hungry, and those who feel lost and forgotten. Ask God to share the blessing He has given you with them. If you do these things, you will welcome the King not only into your home but also into your heart. You will have prepared a room for Him and his Virgin Mother deep within your own soul where they will take refuge and begin to share even deeper blessings with you.

May God bless all of your families this Christmas and for many years to come.


