#### A Message from Father Duc Nguyen

On this second Sunday of Advent, St. John the Baptist makes an appearance. This great prophet announces what is to come in the person of Jesus and warns all his listeners to repent and prepare for the arrival of the Messiah.

His message reflects the message of Isaiah from today's First Reading. Isaiah tells us that the stem that shoots from Jesse's stump demonstrates that even in the midst of failure and despair, God is still working, restoring hope to a crushed people, and bringing about justice and peace when we turn to Him and follow His ways.

Sometimes the most difficult voices to hear are the ones we need to listen to. St. John the Baptist didn't sweeten his message! Even his clothes and way of life spoke a lot about the condition of circumstances in this community. It was a serious situation that necessitated a challenging reaction.

Truth to be told, any age or year might be a desperate period. Sometimes our nation, our planet, or even our own personal lives appear to be crumbling apart, and we realize we have strayed away from God.

The feast of the Lord's birth, which we are currently preparing for, serves as a reminder that God will go to any length to deliver his message of love. Because that is what Isaiah was giving. That is what St. John the Baptist was delivering. And on Christmas, God is born in human flesh to guarantee us forever and always that God's love will remove all obstacles, including becoming one of us, so that we will know we are loved, forgiven, and saved by him.


## **Angel Trees**
