**Deacon Joshua Fultz's message...** One of the most important things a child can do is play. Watch children playing if you want to see how God's law is written on our hearts. I'm not talking about playing video games, but just good old "let's have some fun and use our imaginations" kind of play. You'll see very quickly how children establish rules for how to play any game.

My brothers and I always played war or spy. We had an array of various weapons made from sticks and sometimes grandpa's tools. You never wanted to get caught with the tools, and you dare not leave them out in the rain. We would set up guidelines for who was on what team, where the bases were, and what constituted being out. After all, this was the 80s, and we didn't have paintball guns, and our parents knew better than to give three boys BB guns. We would have shot our eyes out. Nevertheless, these games allowed us to be creative, but more than that, they taught us about boundaries. Whether we suffered hurt feelings, black eyes, or bloody noses, we learned where to draw the line and the consequences for stepping over it.

This week our readings speak of another type of boundary, morality. Today Jesus offers us a set of guide rails for our lives. At that time, many people were looking for the Messiah to come and free them not only from the tyranny of Rome but also from the laws of the Torah. If we're not careful, we can suffer from this same notion today. We look to Jesus as a kind teacher who accepts all our flaws and tells us everything is OK and that we're perfect just the way we are. That's not Jesus, and it's not what he tells us today in the Gospel passage from Matthew.

He says quite clearly says that he doesn't come to abolish the law but to fulfill it. Jesus tells us that if we want to live in true freedom, there must be boundaries set upon our actions. Everything we do has a consequence. It's like physics; for every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction. The boundaries that Christ sets are ones of moral action with the people around us. These boundaries are meant to reign in our base desire to give into sin and self-gratification.

So, this week, as we read and listen to the Gospel, let us think about the times in our lives when we step over the line. We all know there are times when we've had the thought to poke our brother or sister in the back with a sharp stick when they weren't looking. Did we give into that desire, or did we heed the Gospel warning and seek to heal wounds instead of inflicting them? I know I have a lot to think about and pray over. God Bless you all.
