Deacon Joshua Fultz's message . . . Hopefully you have all had a good week of C.R.A.M'ing. For those who missed my homily last week CRAM is a handy acronym to help us remember to be listening for God's call. In this weekend's Gospel reading, Jesus gives us four beatitudes in which St. Ambrose saw the embodiment of the cardinal virtues of temperance, justice, prudence, and fortitude. Unlike the "Sermon on the Mount," this week's "Sermon on the Plain" also gives us four woes. These woes are a warning to not live our lives in worldly excess as they can blind us and keep us from entering into a deeper relationship with our Lord.

Just like Jesus told Peter to take his boat out into deeper waters, he is calling us to move away from the safety net of our worldly lives and move into a deeper relationship with him. The shallow waters close to the shore are calmer, warmer, and more inviting, much like living in a worldly way. The excessive nature of our society can convince us that we should live in the shallow, only thinking about the things we want, rather than the things we need. Instead, we should be listening to Jesus and setting out for deeper waters, through the rough and uncertain waves of living a Christian life. "Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man." It doesn't seem like much of a blessing when you're focused on this world but if we change our outlook so we can see the bigger picture, we begin to understand that this world is only a pit stop the way to the eternal.

If we think about it, "pit stop" is a fairly accurate term. It's in this life that we make adjustments to our spiritual life so that we can run the race at peak performance. Or we can ignore the changes that need to be made and hope that when we cross the finish line we end up in the winner's circle. Like Paul says, we must be living our lives focused on the resurrection, because if we're not, our faith is completely in vain, and Jesus' sacrifice means nothing. So, this week, let's focus on making the tweaks that take us away from living worldly lives and help us to run our race to the fullest.
