<u>Don't Forget</u>: During Lent, Cathedral will have Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 12:30 pm (instead of noon) and 5:30 pm. On Good Friday, Stations of the Cross will be at 3:00 PM.

Father Armentrout's message: This past week, we started the season of Lent with the humble reminder that "We are dust, and unto dust we shall return!" During this Lenten season, we embrace the perennial practice of giving alms, more intensive prayer, and fasting! I'd like to take a moment to share a few remarks on the "Friday Abstinence" and the practice of Penance.

Abstinence, which is considered a penance, is the 'holding back' from taking something that would normally give us pleasure. One can abstain from drink, food, and other things that stimulate our senses. Throughout the season of Lent, the Church's universal law requires us to abstain from taking meat on Fridays. This, of course, is an ancient practice, and one that will only be as beneficial for us as we honestly try to engage in the penitential nature of the fast. In fact, if you recall, a few years ago, Pope Francis was rather critical of the practice that happens in some places of elaborate seafood feasts on Fridays during Lent.

I think it is worth recalling that the Friday fast is ultimately intended to be penitential. In fact, throughout the year, we are called to engage in a weekly penance that unites us to the Passion of Jesus. In Lent, the Church specifies a practice that unites the entire Church together. Throughout the year, here are some ideas of penances that the bishops have suggested as suitable penance. You may even wish to embrace one of these to supplement your Friday Abstinence from meat: Abstaining from other food (desserts, sweets, salt, seasoning, etc.), Alcoholic Drink or smoking, making a special effort for family prayer, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, Friday Stations, a prolonged fast from food (taking only 1 meal), helping the poor, sick or lonely, making a special effort to go to Confession and receive the Eucharist at Mass, etc. I would also encourage our parishioners to take advantage of our Wednesday evenings at St. Mary's (6pm) and Stations of the Cross at Cathedral (12:30pm and 5:30pm).

The purpose of these practices is to unite us to the Cross of Jesus. Let us seek to unite ourselves to Him throughout this Lent, most especially on Fridays.

Know of my prayers for you this Lent! Fr. Armentrout

NB: this year, St. Patrick's day falls on a Friday. The Bishop has given us a dispensation from required abstinence on that day *under the condition* that we still embrace a suitable penance. The dispensation from meat does not mean that we should drink as much as possible and eat piles of corned beef, but we may enjoy some as long as we still embrace another penance that particular day.




