Message from Mother Stella . . .

I would like to share some reflections from the recent SEEK conference Sr. Joanna and I were able to attend in St. Louis, Jan 1-5. Almost 20,000 people gathered, mostly college students, from across the United States, Germany, Austria and Ireland. The conference was sponsored by the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS), based in Denver, Colorado.

One of the keynote addresses was by Monsignor James P. Shea. He spoke about how the devil is always scheming to infect us with his own darkness. The devil tells us that "God is not a good father, He's your rival. It's your happiness or His," whereas the opposite is true. The devil follows us around with personal malice. He wants to kill us. But the good news is that Jesus is our Savior! We are NOT irredeemably broken! The truth is that "if we don't give up, we always win." If we stay faithful to regular confession, communion, personal prayer, and striving for holiness, the devil will be put to flight.

Sr. Mary Grace, SV of the Sisters of Life shared that she used to think that she could overcome all her faults if she just tried hard enough. Eventually, she came to understand that self-reliance cages us in. Jesus is not content with our captivity, with us being enslaved by our sin. God is not a punisher, and He is unafraid of the mess that we are in! We are not God's project, we are not a burden, we are His beloved children. Jesus has preplanned a rescue for me. Sister declared that "Our need for the Savior is our strength!" We just need the courage to call out for help. Come, Lord Jesus!

Thank you to everyone from the Cathedral of St. Joseph, St. Mary, and Our Lady of Guadalupe parishes for your great generosity in helping get the Cathedral convent ready for us, for fundraising and for helping us move in the day before Christmas Eve! Blessings and prayers.




