Dear Cathedral and St. Mary's parishioners,

We give thanks to the Lord for all the time that we were able to spend in St. Joseph this past year. Since we continue to come from our little monastery in Kansas City, Kansas, for about one week of mission per month, we've had the chance to enrich our relationships with the people here, including parishioners, priests, and the poor. Thank you for welcoming us as we seek to shine the light of the Gospel in this city by living out our mission of prayer and begging.

"What do the little sisters do all day in St. Joseph?" you may ask. The first and most important thing that we "do" is pray. Each morning, we rise before the sun and praise God by singing Psalms and hymns, proclaiming the daily Gospel, and adoring Jesus in the Eucharist. This is the foundation of our day, and of our entire lives, and the source of our joy. During adoration, we simply repeat the Gospel in the silence of our hearts, seeking to memorize it, verse by verse. It is only through this daily nourishment with God's Word that we are then able to offer Jesus' presence to the multitudes that we encounter. This long time of prayer, called the "Office of Readings," is the heartbeat of our life as consecrated religious. We pray in the morning, around noon, in the evening, and right before bed, interceding for the world and for those whom we meet.

The deep fulfillment we find in Jesus and His Word is too great for us to keep to ourselves, so we are compelled to share it with others. Around lunchtime, we go door to door not as preachers but as beggars and ask for something to eat. Following in the footsteps of Jesus' disciples, of St. Francis and St. Dominic, we rely completely on Divine Providence for our daily bread. Through this very simple act of begging, we seek to reveal to the people we encounter that God is begging for the love of each of His children. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." (Rev 3:20) God is a beggar who knocks at the door of our hearts, that we may open ourselves to His mercy and to a faithful relationship with Him. The only treasure that we are able to share with those who provide for us is the Word that we keep in our hearts. "I urge you to continue to be nourished by the Word today," Bishop Johnston encouraged us. "That's the meal you share with them. You give them food for their soul."

Our mission allows us to witness, on a daily basis, the beauty of others' generosity, whether they give from their abundance or from the little that they have. Door after door, we discover the diverse face of St. Joseph, a city that gathers an array of countries, cultures, backgrounds, and life stories. To give you an example of our mission, three of us little sisters left the St. Mary's rectory at noon after adoration and began knocking on doors in a section of poor apartments. After receiving a plate of Thanksgiving leftovers at one apartment, we needed a place to sit down and eat, so we continued knocking. A young mother opened her door and welcomed us inside, her four children rushing to our sides to play. She invited us to sit around her kitchen table to eat what we had just received, and she began to share her journey of faith with us. "I was recently baptized. Jesus saved my life," she said with tears in her eyes. One of her sons interrupted her, saying, "I saved your life too, mom!" to which she responded, "Yes. You're right. I became pregnant with him when I was very young. I was going down the wrong path, but having him saved me because I had to take care of him." Her care for her children is a little light in this world, and what a great privilege to have witnessed it firsthand. Before leaving their apartment, we sang them a blessing, and the littlest girl blew kisses to us as we disappeared into the snow.

Simply walking the streets and eating at the food kitchen also allows us to get to know the poor and to share Jesus' presence with them. While eating at the Woodson Chapel's Monday night dinner, we sat down with a poor woman, who was very happy to share the meal with us. Later that week, we saw her again on the sidewalk as we headed back home from begging. When we called out her name, she couldn't believe it. She was overjoyed! "I have called you by name, you are mine." (Isaiah 43:1) As little sisters, we too are overjoyed to offer Jesus' love to people through simple gestures.

Thank you for your support and friendship as we seek to serve and follow Jesus, the Lamb of God, in your diocese. We look forward to returning to St. Joseph on mission throughout this new year!


