### Message from Mother M. Stella, CJD

Dear Parishioners of Cathedral and St. Mary's,

Loving greetings from Vladivostok! We had a wonderful summer camp the last week of June for 20 children, half from our parish and half from a parish 24 hours away by train! Now we are preparing for the far Eastern Catholic young adult conference (ages 16-30) which will also be held at our convent July 28-August 2.

Earlier this week, we had a very precious experience as a community. We learned Sunday evening that one of our elderly parishioners, Nellie, was close to death. We went with one of our brother priests to her home, where he anointed her and she received Holy Communion and the Apostolic Pardon. She was so filled with joy and peace, and kept saying: "I love Jesus, I love each of you, I love Fr. Myron, I love Fr. Daniel, I love Jesus, I am ready to go." She spoke of how much she cherishes her family, of her six grandchildren, and of her longing for her beloved daughter-in-law to be baptized and accept the Catholic faith. She recalled how she decided to become Catholic after her husband entered the Catholic church on his deathbed, in that very room. We then sang her favorite hymns together, which included a hymn to the Holy Spirit and "Ode to Joy".

If you have not already done so, please let your family members know to call the priest if you are very ill or close to death. There is no better way to prepare for the next life than to go to confession, receive Holy Communion and the Anointing of the Sick, and it is a blessing for the entire family.

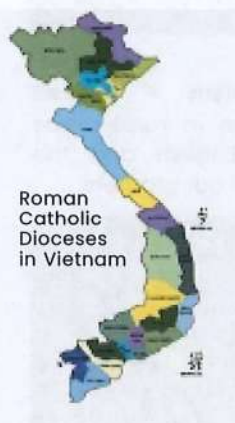

# THE MARIAN FATHERS MISSION IN VIETNAM



## *Strength in the Face of Persecution*

Catholic missionaries first set foot in Vietnam in 1533. By 1665, a seminary had been established, and within just a few years, Vietnamese men were ordained as priests. However, this early growth was met with fierce opposition. The ruling powers feared the Catholic faith would undermine their authority, and brutal persecutions followed. The Catholic faith threatened the ruling powers, and brutal persecution resulted. As many as 300,000 Catholics died during that time, according to the Vatican.

Despite the persecution, the faith endured and grew. By 1889, Vietnam's Church counted:

- 9 bishops
- 219 missionary priests
- 356 Vietnamese priests
- 930 churches
- 1,243 seminarians
- 1,399 religious women
- Over **648,000 lay Catholics**

In 1933, history was made when the first Vietnamese Bishop was consecrated by Pope Pius XI at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Today, there are **27 dioceses** across Vietnam, and 7% of the population is Catholic.

## *Sharing the Gift of the Immaculate Conception*

The Marian Fathers came to Vietnam in 2015 to share their religious charism – that the Virgin Mary's Immaculate Conception reveals what it means to be made new in Christ. With Mary's purity in mind and heart, each of us are called to foster what happened to us at Baptism, when sin was rejected and grace embraced.



With the help of our religious vows, we Marian Fathers are forming a new generation of missionaries in Vietnam, living this charism in prayer, community and service.

## *A Life Like Mary's*

Like Mary, our brothers:

- **Pray together** four times a day—at morning, noon, mid-afternoon, and evening—celebrating Mass, Liturgy of the Hours, and practicing meditation.
- **Learn and teach**, both through formal theological studies and by writing, translating, and publishing for Catholic audiences.
- **Live in community**, sharing meals, daily work, and rest in a spirit of mutual care and respect.
- **Serve the Church**, from catechism classes for children to caring for the elderly in homes run by the Missionaries of Charity.

## *Living the Mission in a Secular-Religious Society*

In today's Vietnam, ancient religious traditions blend with a rising secular economy. Christianity exists alongside animist and folk practices—and a growing thirst for wealth. There is a temptation to spiritual complacency.

Religious identity is strong—but at times it is cultural, not Christ-centered. Our mission is to rekindle the fire of faith through personal discipleship, service, and evangelization. Evangelization is not easy, but it is possible.

## *Why are the Marian Fathers in Vietnam?*

The Marian Fathers bring a distinct charism: To share the grace of Mary's Immaculate Conception—a life made new in Christ through baptism.

Their mission:

- **Form religious brothers and priests** rooted in our Marian spirituality
- **Renew the spirit of mission** in a culture where the Church is present but often passive
- **Live and witness the Gospel** through community, prayer, and service

## *A Growing Mission*

We are blessed to have:

- **Nine Vietnamese Marian brothers** who have professed vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience
- **Four new men in discernment**, exploring the call to religious life
- **Three transitional deacons** preparing for ordination to the priesthood



## *What Makes This Mission Unique?*

### **Walking Pilgrimages –**

Every summer, our brothers walk with young men for two days in Central Vietnam, praying and witnessing together.



**Summer Catechism + English Camps** – Children in rural areas come to learn English and the Catholic faith from our brothers.



**Wearing the Habit** – As of 2023, we've returned to wearing the Marian white habit during prayer and ministry, a sign of our identity.
