# Message From Deacon Joshua Fultz

"What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you?" — John 6:30

This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. For me, this solemnity is a time of renewal. Just like we renew our baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil, we can use this day to renew our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

As I have stated many times before, the Eucharist is one of the main reasons I became Catholic, and it holds a special place in my heart. Yet, I must admit that there are times when I feel like I am merely going through the motions. My brain wanders off to other worries and cares of the day and I lose focus on what is happening at the mass. I lose sight of the eternal mystery that is unfolding just a few feet away from my face. I fail to see that beautiful moment when Father is speaking the words of consecration and bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus Christ. That is the beauty of this solemnity. It gives us a chance to realign ourselves and begin to approach the body, blood, soul, and divinity of our Lord with the reverence and awe he is owed.

The Eucharist should permeate and change our lives. It should be a compass for how we approach not only the Mass, but also our faith and the way we live. Sadly, we can become numb to this awe-inspiring event and start to act like the Jewish people who were asking for a sign. Instead of coming to the Mass ready to meet the King, we come ready for the backyard barbecue or the sporting event we plan to attend later in the day. It's almost as if we become like the Roman soldiers who stripped Jesus of his clothes. We strip the meaning and life changing importance of the Mass from our hearts. How heartbreaking this must be to our Lord.

This week, let us all renew our belief in the real presence of Christ and let him enter our hearts and change our lives even more. Let us all approach the Eucharist in awe and repeat the words of St. Thomas, "My Lord and my God!"
