Xavier adapted that for us and has started a little club, with assistance of Dan Pfister and Joe Wise, that Xavier calls "Our Lady's Knights." The priests that knew Charles call him "My Lady's Knight" after it was recalled that Charles simply called Mary, "My Lady."
