Father Armentrout's message . . . Veiling our senses

This weekend in many Catholic Parishes throughout the world, statues and images of the Cross are being covered with violet or deep red fabrics! This has been a long-standing tradition in the Church. At first, it might seem odd- since we are supposed to be meditating upon the Cross, right? Certainly, we are called to meditate upon the Cross. But we deprive ourselves of sight of the Cross for two reasons. The first reason- from Passion Sunday (today) through Palm Sunday and the Sacred Triduum, the Church considers her liturgy to especially represent our Lord's Passion from his entry into Jerusalem to the Glorious resurrection, the liturgy reflects what took place in our Lord's life. Furthermore, it is a reminder to us that not only are we to celebrate these things, but we are to listen to them *as if they were unfolding before our own eyes*. On a practical note, the time of veiling the statues has a great spiritual benefit! It helps us rejoice more on Easter when we walk into the Church and experience the building in all its splendor, bursting with flowers, smell of incense and great music! In addition to veiling the statues, we should attempt to 'veil' or deprive our senses of good things in these next two weeks! I would suggest things like leaving vegetables unsalted, avoiding desserts and sweets, and turning our eyes away from technology. Sometimes when we use our phones, we don't even recognize how much we are on them until the Sunday morning 'screen time' notification flashes across the screen. If you cannot put your phone down sometime over these next two weeks because work or family obligations demand your use of them, I would suggest changing the color setting to black and white until Easter, or turn off the 'facial unlock' features and change the password to something that will make you think twice before using the device. Those are just several ideas to help you formulate something that will better help you 'veil' your senses over these next couple of weeks to participate more fully in the Cross of Christ.
