A Brief History of the Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross is a beloved devotion for any time of year, but is especially honored during Lent. The fourteen Stations which adorn the aisles of nearly every Catholic Church in the world have evolved over time. Let's take a quick look at the history of this devotion.

According to pious tradition, the Blessed Virgin Mary was the first to visit the scenes of our Lord's passion along the streets of ancient Jerusalem, but when the Roman Emperor Constantine legalized Christianity in 312, a path through the city was formally marked with small churches at the various locations where Jesus had once walked. St. Jerome (342-420), who lived in Bethlehem, attested to the large numbers of pilgrims from other countries who visited the holy sites and followed the Way of the Cross.

By the fifth century, some European churches had begun to build replicas of Jerusalem's sacred sites for those who were unable to visit the sacred Land. For example, St. Petronius, Bishop of Bologna, constructed a group of chapels at the monastery of San Stefano depicting the more important shrines of the Holy Land, including several Stations of the Cross. However, the Stations of the Cross we know today did not develop until the 15th century, when the Turkish conquest of the Holy Land made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem practically impossible.

The Stations of the Cross have not always been the same fourteen Stations we know today. Both the number of stations and their names have varied greatly. Several Stations of the Cross which once existed included: Christ passing through the gates of Jerusalem, Christ visiting King Herod's house, and Christ passing by Simon the Pharisee's house.

By the end of the 17th century, Stations of the Cross had grown in popularity, but their number and variety had begun to perplex the faithful. Some churches had fourteen Stations; some had up to seventeen. So, in 1731, Pope Clement XII set the number at fourteen—and formally established the Stations we know today. In 1742, Pope Benedict XIV advised all priests to embellish their churches with the Way of the Cross, stating that a cross must accompany each Station, even if depicting the scene itself is impracticable. This is why, even today, certain "Stations of the Cross" are made up entirely of small crosses and Roman numerals.

Here at Cathedral of St. Joseph, we celebrate the Stations of the Cross every Friday noon and evening in Lent, at 12:30 and 5:30 pm.

Coram Deo is a Eucharistic-centered Catholic group which exists to meet the needs of young adults in the St. Joseph area and to provide opportunities for spiritual growth and fellowship.
