Father Hansen's message: "(Christ) may be leading me out to a cross. If so, I can have no hesitation about following Him! I must follow Him closely, so that ... I shall be near Him, my Good Shepherd, Who will help me to carry it, for He still bears His Cross in each one of His children."

This quote above is a nice one to pray over in Lent. I write this on Friday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, on St. Katharine Drexel's memorial and the 155<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the erecting of the Diocese of St. Joseph by Pope Pius IX.

St. Katharine was the daughter of railroad entrepreneurs and ultimately was able to pass on all the family wealth to help Indian and African American children receive a Catholic Education and encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. She, of course, faced many difficulties in providing education to these two groups; slavery had been abolished in 1865 and Katharine was just 7 years old. The environment of excluding certain peoples was still very present.

This Lent, as we pray, fast, and give alms, may we consider giving to Catholic Charities (https://catholiccharities-kcsj.org/donate/) who assist those on the margins of society as St. Katharine Drexel did with those of her day. May we also all receive our tax credits through Bright Futures/MOScholars (https://www.brightfuturesfund.org/moscholars\_taxcredits.html), with no sacrificial cost, building the fund that also helps us educate children that once thought Catholic Education was out of their reach as did the Indian and African American children in St. Katharine's day! St. Katharine Drexel, pray for us!
