#### A Message from Father Hansen

Over the course of these weeks of praying the Our Father in Latin on the weekends, we've had some questions about why? I've spoken with a good number of you individually, and you've also spoken with the other priests here as well as Fr. Armentrout, Deacon Josh, and Xavier, too. I'm grateful for your openness, and your dialogue. A few of you have wondered why it was changed from English, what's the point of it, and why we are singing instead of speaking the prayer.

The Our Father was given to us by Jesus himself, and it is one of the central prayers of the Mass and of the Church. Before Vatican II in the 1960s, the Mass was in Latin. Everything in the Church was in Latin, as it had been since Constatine made the Catholic Church the official religion of the Roman Empire in the 4<sup>th</sup> century. Latin remains the universal language of the church even as local churches use their own language for Masses and sacraments. In fact, one of our younger priests who studied the Council in Seminary, for his Master of Arts, told me Vatican II documents encouraged certain things to be kept in Latin - especially the Gloria, Creed, Agnus Dei, Our Father, & Sanctus. And the reason implied is so the universal church - with all its particular churches - shares a common language of prayer.

Back to why here, now? First, while I was in seminary we were simply told to be sure our faithful knew the Our Father, Gloria, and Creed in Latin (maybe this was referring to what this young priest told me). Then, after discussions with Mother Stella — Director of Music at the time - I decided that we should give it a go during this period of Ordinary Time. By praying the Our Father in Latin, we are reminded that we are part of the Universal Church that spans the globe, and we are joined in prayer with all our Catholic brothers and sisters though this common language, despite the reality that not all are praying it in Latin. The singing and opposed to reciting was a selfish decision, it's easier for me to sing it than recite the Our Father in Latin.

To ease the adjustment during this time of learning, the Pater Noster with the English translation was put in the pews, and it can be found in your hymnals (page 52). If you are struggling to sing, feel free to speak the Latin instead or just follow along and ask to see the beauty... Consider praying the Pater Noster at home with your families before Mass or during the week, to prepare for Sunday Mass.

Every Sunday the Holy Father comes to a window of St. Peter's and leads the Angelus in Latin (Our Father is prayed there three times). Every Wednesday, the Holy Father ends his Wednesday Audience with the Our Father in Latin. One day you may be in his presence, and because of this short period, you will be able to join in!

Thank you for your patience with me in this pastoral decision. Forgive me for any unrest; it was not at all intentional. We'll continue using the Latin Our Father for this stretch just until the beginning of Advent, then return to English. Please pray for me!


