Message from Deacon Joshua Fultz... Scraped Knees for Lent

Standing on the precipice of another Lent, the readings for this week brought back some memories I would like to share. As a kid, I tended to be fearless, sometimes to my detriment. I was continually banging up my body, trying to do that new trick on my skateboard or BMX bike. Back in those days — wink wink — we didn't need those fancy knee pads and helmets to protect us, once again probably to my detriment, so I regularly had scraped knees. Bloodied or bruised, it didn't stop me; I still had to do those tricks. No matter how many times I fell, I popped back up and started again.

So how does that tie into Lent? I don't know about you, but more than once, my Lent began as a goodwill intention that somewhere down the road changed into "how in the heck did I get that far off the yellow brick road." I start out all gangbusters with a great idea for something to give up or something to start doing, and then I fall. I think it's in those moments when we fall that, like little kids, we decide that the pavement is just too hot, and we choose to walk in the grass. As we walk the easier path, we begin to stray farther and farther away from the road, and eventually, we give up.

Instead of giving you another how-to, or a list of dos and don'ts, I want to inspire you to have a different mindset about Lent. I want each of us to be more like that fearless little kid with scraped knees this Lent. When we fall, we're not going to lay on the ground crying; we're going to pop back up, but with a little help. God is that loving Father ready to help us up and brush off the gravel and spray on the Bactine to help clean out our wounds. Lent is a time of cleansing and reconciliation. It is a time to heal and to come back to a love that knows no bounds.

So, this Lent, scrape up those knees but remember to come home so the Father can heal your wounds.
