Father Hansen's message . . .

Tomorrow we celebrate the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi. Of course, Pope Francis is named after him. In some ways a great reformer of the Church, St. Francis saw the plight of the poor, and left his wealthy family to put everything in God's hands! Today, Franciscan religious orders are thriving around the world. I'm quite familiar with one based in New York, the CFR's. In our own Diocese, there are Franciscans in Savannah and elsewhere. One community that's been in our Diocese since 1892 is the Sisters of St. Francis of the Holy Eucharist. Each month, Fr. Armentrout offers Masses for the Sisters who reside at the north end of Nolan Road in Independence (www.osfholyeucharist.org).

What can we learn from St. Francis? One thing for sure would be to love the poor. Another would be to love Christ crucified (he came up with the Stations of the Cross). Finally, another that comes to mind is to love the infant Jesus (he came up with the Nativity Scene). Whatever your image of St. Francis, I hope you'll open you hearts to the poor (pray I do, too), maybe spend some time meditating on the Crucifix, and also put yourself in the manger scene! Pray for the Franciscans in our Diocese and those communities you may know elsewhere.


