“You are my inheritance, O Lord!” (Ps 16)

Father Hansen’s message . . . Today is the 5th World Day of the Poor as proclaimed by Pope Francis. In his message for the day, Pope Francis begins with quoting our Lord “The poor you will always have with you” (Mk 14:7). He then, in the message - you can read it in full here: <https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/messages/poveri/documents/20210613-messaggio-v-giornatamondiale-poveri-2021.html> (on the Cathedralsj.org website and click “Bulletins” to get the link) – spoke of two matters that caught my attention. First, he spoke of the place of empathy. Secondly, one of the points the Holy Father made was that Jesus “shares the lot of the poor.”

So often when we see the poor we can make snap judgments, so to speak. I’ve mentioned my first having to acknowledge of that about myself when I’d drive from south of Kansas City into the city along Highway 71. Those at the street corners got a little judgement from me. One day I received a grace to stop, and I started getting \$2 bills each January to pass out throughout the year. By having empathy, I was able to serve. By making excuses (being empathetic, no?) for why they might be there I could encounter them and not judge.

On November 11th we celebrated the Memorial of St. Martin of Tours. St. Martin had been baptized at age 18 and eventually would become a Bishop. Soon after he became Christian, he encountered a poor person. This account of the poor person has been handed on: *Once, while on horseback in Amiens in Gaul (modern France), he encountered a beggar. Having nothing to give but the clothes on his back, Martin cut his heavy officer’s cloak in half, and gave it to the beggar. Later he had a vision of Christ wearing the cloak.* Jesus shares the lot of the poor.

We might not have visions of Christ with the faces of those we help, but we can always give people the benefit of the doubt, make excuse for them, and keep serving. After all, the Lord did say: “The poor you will always have with you” (Mk 14:7).
