Message from Father Armentrout... Today we enter the liturgical season of Advent! The name "Advent" is derived from the Latin Prefix Ad- meaning "Towards" + the verb Venire- meaning "To Come". In this season, we anticipate the coming of Christ in Christmas! There are several important characteristics of this season. First, this season's character is penitential. We prepare for the coming of Christ into our hearts by making room for Him. Much like expectant parents would prepare to welcome a newborn Child into their home, we ought to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ by making use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and taking up some minor form of penance.

Secondly, this season- in the words of St. John Paul the Second- is a Marian season! As a Church, we strive to draw closer to Mary who welcomed Christ most perfectly into the world in the Incarnation. Christ came to this world the first time through the power of the Holy Spirit and through the "Yes" of Mary. In drawing closer to Mary during this season, we set before our minds and hearts her "Yes" so that we can accept Christ with the same loving fidelity. I'd like to invite you to attend our Second Annual Advent Novena (See the Attached Schedule)! Most especially, I'd like to invite you to attend the Solemn Vespers Service at Cathedral next Sunday evening!

Finally, here is a prayer from St. John Paul II that I would invite you to pray during throughout the season of Advent:

May the Virgin Mary help us to open the doors of our hearts to Christ, Redeemer of man and of history; may she teach us to be humble, because God looks upon the lowly; may she enable us to grow in understanding the value of prayer, of inner silence, of listening to God's Word; may she spur us to seek God's will deeply and sincerely, even when this upsets our plans; may she encourage us while we wait for the Lord, sharing our time and energies with those in need.
