

Deacon Joshua Fultz's Message . . .

This weekend as we celebrate Palm Sunday, we will begin the Liturgy of the Word with readings and a solemn procession with palms welcoming our King, and then end it by crucifying him. It's around this week every year that I make sure I watch Mel Gibson's *Passion of the Christ*, and every year there is one scene that just sticks with me. For a lot of people, it's the scourging at the pillar, but for me it's after they have lowered Jesus' body into the arms of Mary, and she turns her eyes to look directly at the viewer. It's a convicting moment for me. I can hear our Blessed Mother saying, "Look at what he endured for you. What are you willing to endure for him?" I think that is a good question for all of us to ponder this Palm Sunday as we recite those words we all hate to say, "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" What are we willing to endure for Christ? Are we willing to go out and spread his gospel message of dying to sin and rising to new life in Him?

As you know, Mandy and I are a part of an organization called Legion of Mary and we would like to invite everyone of you to come join us. The Legion puts to action those words "what are you willing to endure for Him?" We will be making visits door to door to spread the message of salvation and love to people who have never heard it, people who have chosen to ignore or not believe it, and people who don't believe that they can ever be saved.
