# Father Hansen's message . . . Happy Easter!!!!!

I always enjoy saying Happy Easter for the full eight days of the octave: what a joyful time!! I presume not too many of us will forget this Easter, when we couldn't go to church physically and greet people with those words face to face. You know, I'm sure, that you are presented to God - you and your joys, sorrows, work, and play – through the priest to the Father at every Mass, nonetheless, whether you're here or not. Yes, you'd rather be here, but our Faith tells us as the Body of Christ, we're all presented to the Father through the Son at every Mass. Maybe this Easter we'll take renewed comfort and solace on that fact!

Going back to the "octave"; a change that happened during my priestly formation (seminary) that has also been a great joy to me is the reality of what the Church has given on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus said this to St. Maria Faustina about this day (next Sunday):

I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. Diary 699 [Note: confession does not have to be done on the Sunday itself. Beforehand is fine.]

Our faith doesn't leave us empty on Easter Sunday because we sin or have a problem. Our Lord, Jesus Christ, on the evening of that first Easter instituted the Sacrament of Confession (Penance). On the evening of the Easter Octave (the 8<sup>th</sup> day of it) we meditate on that. I present it here as a joyful thing to ponder this Easter Sunday. That the day our Lord rose from the dead he started a tradition so that we can experience Easter joy each and every time we go to Confession.
