Deacon Joshua Fultz's Message . . .

Now by this we may be sure that we know him, if we obey his commandments. Whoever says, "I have come to know him," but does not obey his commandments, is a liar, and in such a person the truth does not exist; but whoever obeys his word, truly in this person the love of God has reached perfection. — 1 John 2:3-5

One of the biggest objections I hear from my non-churchgoing friends goes something like this, "Why would I want to waste a perfectly good Sunday sitting in church with a bunch of hypocrites? Going to church doesn't make you holy."

In one regard they are correct, simply going to church doesn't make you holy. Some of the most evil people I have met, I met in church. They will smile at you and say the "holy" words and all the while they are plotting against you. Satan did something similar when he tried tempting our Lord. Today John is telling us we can't SIMPLY go to church. Our time spent in the pews must have purpose. We must be intentional about our faith.

If we are intentional in how we participate in the Mass, we will have no choice but to be changed. When we open our ears and really listen to the Word, we begin to enter into dialogue with Jesus and our relationship with him will grow. We will find that we want to talk with him more and more outside of the Mass. We might even begin to truly start looking at those places where we need to change our lives or even find healing. If we judge our faith on the worst examples in the pews, we may begin to find we become those worst examples. Going to Mass just becomes something we do because that's what we've always done. Our faith becomes a hollow shell and one day we discover that we really don't know Jesus. We say we do, because we check the boxes, but in our heart of hearts we know Jesus isn't there. We become the liars that John is speaking about.

So today, let us make a new resolve to be intentional in our walk with Jesus Christ. Let us come to Mass ready to ignore the liars and focus our attention on the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Let us admit we are sinners in need of an advocate and open our hearts to Him.

On behalf of the Cathedral Food Pantry, its invaluable volunteers, and especially all of our neighbors in Christ that come to our door, we would like to say, 'Thank You!' to the Altar Society and all of the volunteers and attendees that made the St. Joseph's Day Dinner a tremendous success.
