A Message from Deacon Joshua Fultz...

"Therefore, brothers and sisters, select from among yourselves seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit..." — Acts 6:3,5

My favorite part of any holiday has always been the big family dinners. The food is usually fantastic, and you get to see family and friends that maybe you haven't seen in months or even years. I have noticed that those large dinners have begun to disappear for many families. As children grow up and move away to start families of their own, and as the elders who once anchored these gatherings pass on, the tradition begins to fade. It doesn't help that we live in a world that no longer values human interaction.

Many people feel invisible, even in our parish pews. Whether it's the widows or widowers trying to navigate life without their spouse or the new face that came into town and is trying to find a new home, each feels invisible in their own way. If you're homebound, that sense of invisibility multiplies exponentially.

This Easter, I want to take up the call of the first deacons: the call to care for the "widows and orphans" — the invisible. In this regard, I hope to start a new tradition in our parishes, St. Stephen's Easter Banquet. It's an Easter dinner named after the first deacon and martyr; and dedicated to the memory of my mentor and friend Deacon Steve Welsh. Dcn. Steve and his wife Catherine, along with some other great people in our parish, welcomed Mandy and me into the Catholic Church twenty years ago and made sure we never felt invisible.

This dinner is a way to do the same for the **INVISIBLE** in our parishes. It is a way for Mandy and me to give back to our Church family the tremendous gift they gave us. Whether you feel invisible or just long for a sense of belonging, I want to personally invite you to *please* join us in celebrating the resurrection of our Lord with food, laughter, and fellowship and be raised to new life in our parish family.

To those who still have big family dinners, *keep them going!* And next time you come to Mass, take a moment to smile or wave at someone near you. That simple gesture could be exactly what someone needs to feel *seen*.




