## Father Hansen's message . . .

Happy Easter!!!!!

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. The Gospel reading is from St. John, the institution of the sacrament of Confession by our Lord himself. Jesus told the Disciples in the Upper Room, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven." (Jn. 20:23).

You might say, great, Father, but we cannot go to Confession. Soon, the social distancing and the charity and common good measures taken now will be revised and you will return to the sacrament. One of our parishioners wrote me an email where he said, "I'll never take the Mass for granted again." My sister Gail, just a year younger than me, said she cried the first weekend she couldn't go to Mass. I bet many of you will find a new and deeper appreciation for Confession when we return to church, too! The depth of God's love for us that has been poured out to those in need of Mercy at the hour of death, due to the coronavirus, was touching to me. I've written about this before, and you may have read it from our website or the diocesan site. God's love, too, was poured out to St. Faustina, who was instructed to have this Sunday declared Divine Mercy Sunday. She was not told to have the Gospel reading changed, but to highlight what the Sunday is all about, Divine Mercy, God's Mercy. All this is documented in her Diary of Mercy. In a nutshell, the Marians of the Immaculate Conception tell us the message of Divine Mercy and can be recalled by remembering ABC:

- **A** Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- **B** Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- C Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

May the parishes of Cathedral and St. Mary's be promoters of Mercy and example of Mercy! St. Faustina, pray for us! St. Joseph, pray for us! Mary, Mother of Mercy, pray for us!
