Message from Father Hansen He is Risen, He is Risen! Happy Easter!!!!

It's hard to imagine the Christmas message that Christ enters into time so we can enter into eternity when meditating on the scene in the manger, the little vulnerable baby, God almighty, surrounding by Mary and Joseph; thinking this is where it begins. Now we celebrate the culmination (maybe Pentecost; and the sending the Holy Spirit to aid us), the Resurrection!

We all need resurrections in our lives. We all need to go through Good Fridays before our resurrections, too. This Holy Week, a writing of St. Basil from the Liturgy of the Hours caught my attention. It goes as follows:

We imitate Christ's death by being buried with him in baptism. If we ask what this kind of burial means and what benefit we may hope to derive from it, it means first of all making a complete break with our former way of life, and our Lord himself said that this cannot be done unless a man is born again. In other words, we have to begin a new life, and we cannot do so until our previous life has been brought to an end. When runners reach the turning point on a racecourse, they have to pause briefly before they can go back in the opposite direction. So also when we wish to reverse the direction of our lives there must be a pause, or a death, to mark the end of one life and the beginning of another.

As we "paused" this Lent to look at our course and race, today we ask for the correct path, the correct pace, such that our journey to our heavenly home will include many being brought with us. Let us recall that Sunday is to the week what this day, Easter, is to the year. Every week we have a chance to examine our conscience at the beginning of Mass, or before Mass in preparation for Confession - to pause - and move on forward. Here on the hill tops of the Cathedral of St. Joseph and St. Mary's, let us make the Mass the center of our week. Let us trust that the Risen Lord, and his parents, Mary and Joseph, will help us join our Bishop in being one family, restored in Christ, equipped for mission!
