On Wednesday, April 26th, Bishop Johnston will be offering a Mass of Healing at noon in our Cathedral for those impacted by sexual abuse. All are welcome to come pray for healing in the Church and Society.

Join us on Friday, April 28th as we begin a 33-day preparation for Marian Consecration on May 31st. Each day we'll individually follow four great Marian giants: St. Louis de Montfort, St. Maximilian Kolbe, St. Mother Teresa, and Pope John Paul II. They'll teach us the secrets to drawing closer to the Heart of Jesus through the Heart of Mary. In our weekly group sessions, beginning Sunday, April 30th between the 8:30 and 11:30am Masses (approximately 10 am after coffee and donuts), we'll share our insights within our small groups and then watch a 30- minute video by popular author and speaker, Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC. The book "33 Days to Morning Glory" will be available for purchase after this weekend's Masses. A free abbreviated booklet will also be available.

Father Benjamin Armentrout's Message . . . Marian Consultation

This Friday, the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Louis Marie de Montfort. St. Louis Marie de Montfort is often remembered as one of the greatest 'confessors' of Mary- since he wrote several books and led many to a deeper and more profound love of our Blessed Mother. I would highly recommend the books *True Devotion* and *The Secret of the Rosary*.

Personally, one of my favorite Marian devotional practices is the *Marian Consultation*, which is derived from the disciples of St. Louis Marie de Montfort. *Marian Consultation* is the practice of asking Mary what her thoughts are about every decision in our life. The scriptural foundation for this practice can be found in the 19th Chapter of John. Most English translations of the Johannine Gospel translate the beloved disciple's words to mean: "from that hour, he took her into his *own home*." The Greek word used by the Gospel of John is fascinating. It notes that "He took her into his *own*" but does not specify what exactly. There is no reference to a *home* in the Greek. The common way of translating such passages would be with the word 'things'. John took Mary into his own 'things' (on a side note, *home* sounds much more humane-hence the common translation!). In other words, John brought Mary into every single aspect of his life. When she came to live with him, he would have to tend to her needs. He would have the privilege of speaking with her. He would recall with her the life of her son. He would learn from her a more perfect and pure Love of God. In short, since he was taking on the responsibility of accepting Mary as his mother, he would need to bring her into his 'own' everyday life.

Here's how this devotion works. We enthrone a nice picture of Mary in a prominent place of our house or room. We intentionally set aside a few minutes each day to use the image to help us pray to Jesus through her intercession. We ask Mary to help us have a purer Love. We ask her what is most pleasing to her son! We tell her what we have going on for the day. We ask her if that would be okay with her. And we beseech her for her help and assistance. Each moment in the day when we are aware of a decision to be made, we stop and intentionally bring Mary into the decision. We lovingly say her name in prayer or recite an 'Ave Maria.'

Regardless of whether you wish to adopt this particular devotion into your prayer life, I would highly encourage frequent recourse to Mary through some form of devotion since she knew and loved her son better than we ever could!


