Place new or gently used adult or children's book in the crate located by the lending library bookcase.



Deacon Joshua Fultz's message . . .

"Blessed are those who hear the Word of God and observe it." – Luke 11:28

I am so happy to have this opportunity this week to write to each of you and say, "THANK YOU!" Thank you for coming together as a parish family to care for one of our families that lost everything to a fire. You gave this family a beautiful gift by lifting them up spiritually, financially, and physically amid their suffering, similar to the way our Lord lifted up the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven, body and soul. Most of all, you have heard the Word of God and observed it in your care for the poor. You have cared for Christ himself by caring for this family, just as he said in Matthew 25:40, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." Tuesday as I celebrated the feast day of St. Lawrence, the patron saint of deacons, it occurred to me that each of you helped to answer this poor excuse for a deacon's call to care for the widows and orphans. You modeled the spirit of diakonia or faithful service, but I want you to go farther. It's easy when we are caring for one of our own, even if it is a family in the parish we don't know. I want you to carry this spirit of faithful service out into the world that is not your family. I want you to get out of your comfort zone to care for someone in the community in a way that you may never see a reward or hear a thank you. Shake the hand of the person in need, get their name, look them in the eye and remind them that they still are a human with God given dignity and that you're going to pray for them. You never know where they may be; at the gas pump, in line at the grocery store, on a street corner, you'll know the time. If that's too far out of your comfort zone, just smile. Smile at everyone you see and watch what happens. You never know how your smile or kind word could completely change the world of someone who is hurting. It's easy to think that we can't make a difference in the midst of a suffering world, but that is a lie of the evil one. You can make a change; you've already proven that. Now go forth with our Blessed Mother and lift up this fallen world!
