A Message from Deacon Joshua Fultz

"The Land Without Sunday"

Recently I read an excerpt from the 1955 book "*Around the Year with the Trapp Family*," by Maria Von Trapp. That's right, the same Maria from "The Sound of Music." This particular essay was titled "*The Land Without Sunday*." In this essay Maria describes what Sundays were like right before World War II and how they were celebrated, but the piece that most caught my attention was the story that Maria tells about their neighbor's visit to Russia one year before the war began.

"Instead of a Sunday," Baron K. told us, "the Russians have a day off. This happens at certain intervals which vary in different parts of the country. First, they had a five-day week, with the sixth day off, then they had a nine-day work period, with the tenth day off; then again it was an eight-day week. What a difference between a day off and a Sunday! The people work in shifts. While one group enjoys its day off, the others continue to work in the factories or on the farms or in the stores, which are always open. As a result, the over-all impression throughout the country was that of incessant work, work, work. The atmosphere was one of constant rush and drive."

This one hits a little close to home. Here they are talking about Communist Russia, but they could almost be talking about the U.S.A. of today. I say almost, because I recognize not every Sunday is about work, but it isn't necessarily about worshipping God either. I am just as guilty as the next person, using Sunday to catch up on yard work or freelance projects.

As a country we have embraced the idea of a day of worship with a "day off." If we aren't careful, we trade the worshipping at the altar of Sacrifice for worshipping at the altar of whatever idol we embrace. Sure, we give God our 1-hour obligation, but then we're tempted to sacrifice the rest of our day to anything but prayer.

I know, I know, there are reasons. There are always reasons. It doesn't negate the fact that it's up to us to make a choice. Will we choose to enter into the celebration of Sunday, or will we choose to just have a day off? I invite all of you to read the essay and see what Sundays used to be like for the Trapp family.
