Message from Amy Roetto . . .

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

It's hard to believe it has already been 3 years since we invited our new priest, Father Hansen, over for dinner, and his subtle art of persuasion pulled me into one of his wonderful ideas for our parish. After a year of struggles for our school, he seemed to already know he wanted to bring adoration to our parish, focused on our school and children. He just needed someone to organize the details, which is where I came in. I don't think he walked in our door with the intention of asking me to take on this role, but when we started talking about the MIR House and I told him briefly of my own experience there, I think the bell went off and he realized he may have found his person.

Adoration has been such a positive experience in my life, and I want everyone to be able to have that experience whether it is at Cathedral, the MIR House, or elsewhere. I don't recall much previous experience or knowledge of adoration prior to returning to St. Joseph in 2007. We slowly started to learn about the MIR House, and my husband eventually took a weekly hour there. I filled in here and there, but it wasn't until my youngest daughter started part-time preschool in 2017 that I finally had a chance to really experience the power of adoration. I had about 3 hours to myself twice a week while all the children were in school! I had a million things to squeeze into those few hours, but there were a couple things that were especially weighing on me and that I was struggling with at the time. So I decided to use some of that precious time alone to go and pray about my worries up close and personal with Jesus. Looking back, I realize my other visits to adoration were more out of obligation, rather than the desire or necessity to be there. My pull to go there while Sophie was at preschool was more of the latter, and that allowed me to really feel the presence of Christ and the true blessing of adoration. I felt at peace. I felt like the burden of my worries was lessened. Those feelings kept me going back week after week on my own time, not out of obligation. Over the years, in addition to helping me through times of struggle, I have noticed that adoration is when I am most clear minded. What a crazy world we live in, and we are always on the quest for truth. Adoration is where I feel most confident in the truth that comes from our Savior, and not from our world. In John, Chapter 14 Jesus says, "I am the way and the truth and the life." This truly sums up adoration for me.

While we have continued adoration on a smaller scale throughout the summer, we are looking forward to another school year beginning soon and returning to adoration 5 days a week during school hours. I invite everyone to reach out to me to learn more about coming to adoration at Cathedral. There is no commitment and adorers are free to sign up as often as they would like to as it fits their schedules. From retired parishioners to parents on lunch breaks or with new found flexible work-from-home schedules, to stay at home parents with babies in tow, we have welcomed them all. And I encourage everyone to find a time and place to make adoration work for you. I'm sure the quiet, peacefulness of adoration sounds appealing to all of us in our busy lives, but I am the first to admit that it is still hard sometimes to make the commitment to take an hour when I have so many other things to get done. I remember the benefits though, and that I have never once regretted going to adoration instead of the grocery store.
