Father Armentrout's message . . . This past week at the Cathedral all the students came back from their summer vacation with the cultural experience of having a bagpiper lead them through the school. The melodies encouraged thoughts of American Patriotism along with many other beautiful thoughts (and perhaps a few accompanying looks of confusion)!!! I think it is an important time, as students throughout the country are returning to their classrooms, to recall the importance of Education. (Since I am teaching Latin along with the Theology classes this year, I can't help myself from making an important linguistic observation about this word). Education comes from the Latin word ducare- to draw out. It begins with the prefix E- out of or from. One of the important parts of Education is to draw out the truth. God has filled us with the great capacity to come to know, love and serve him. As I mentioned in my first homily at the Cathedral and St. Mary's parishes, St. Paul says that "God wills all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the Truth." (1 Tim 2:4). The purpose of all education and study is to come to an understanding of the truth as knowledge of the truth is mysteriously united to our salvation. Any encounter with the truth can be transformed, when accompanied by prayer and other religious acts, into an encounter with the person of Jesus Christ who said, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." Every time a student learns something new in the classroom, this can be an authentic encounter with our Lord and Savior. Even mathematical equations can enkindle a sense of wonder in our students as they discover a sense of order ruling the world around them.

Parents can model this too by striving to come to the truths of the faith as a family. Important ways this can be done is by praying with scripture together, reading the catechism, hanging beautiful art of both religion and scenes of nature in the home, and encountering the Creator in nature. Wondering at the beauty of creation and nature is an important part of education! I once met a farmer who was able to reiterate an entire argument (or proof) for the existence of God that mirrored a proof which St. Thomas Aquinas wrote in his famous Summa Theologiae. This farmer equipped with nothing more than a high school education had never read a philosophical book in his life but had come to understand through hours of reflective thought on a tractor that we can prove the existence of a creator by observing the changes in the seasons and growth of his livestock and crops. Our lives as Christians, whether we are adults or children alike, ought to be marked with a lively sense of wonder and longing to encounter the person of Jesus Christ. We should strive to encounter Him as we can find Him by the light of our human reason. But above all, we should strive to encounter Him as he reveals Himself to us by the light of Faith.

Dear Cathedral of St. Joseph Parish,

We are very grateful to Fr. Hansen for inviting us to St. Joseph, Missouri, to make the Cathedral convent our motherhouse. We will be living at St. Mary's rectory until the renovations are complete.

Sisters in Jesus the Lord is a new community, founded to help revive the Catholic church in far Eastern Russia. We have been in the diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph since 2009 at Our Lady of Lourdes parish in Raytown, Missouri. After much prayer and discernment, we have discerned that it is best for our community's ongoing training and future growth to relocate our community.

It seems fitting in this Year of St. Joseph that we have accepted the invitation to make the Cathedral convent our motherhouse for a number of important reasons:

- Our charism is to be missionary canonesses living in Jesus, dedicated to evangelization through the parish, through music and liturgy, catechesis and pro-life work, and we are excited to share those gifts with your Cathedral parish, as we train new sisters for Russia:
 - Canonesses have traditionally been at cathedrals whenever possible to help lead the liturgy of the hours.
 - There is college ministry at the cathedral, which is good preparation for our work with students in Russia.
 - St. Joseph's Cathedral parish and school and the St. Gianna Center are eager to host Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, a continuation of our ministry and good training for work in Russia.
 - The national pro-life shrine is eager to help with healing after abortion and Rachel's Vineyard retreats, with which we are already involved.
- St. Joseph is not far from Benedictine College, and one of our sisters just started studying there August 25. We have hopes that some of the college students may feel called to serve the Church as sisters in Russia.

We do have some special connections to your parish already:

- Sr. Faustina Marie (Erica) Goedken was a volunteer Spanish teacher for grades 4-8 at the Cathedral school for a year before she entered our community, and a regular volunteer at the ECC.
- Sr. Faustina's father, Deacon Martin Goedken, was director of Catholic Charities in St. Joseph for many years.
- The diocese where we serve in far Eastern Russia is also the "Diocese of St. Joseph," based in Irkutsk, Russia.

As you probably know, it will take some work to make the Cathedral convent into a convent once again, after having been the Early Childhood Center for so many years. We look forward to getting to know you and to working together!


