Father Hansen's message . . . The last time I wrote for the Bulletin I followed up on Amy Roetto's letter about Adoration at the Parish, particularly for our children in school (here and elsewhere). Thank you for stepping up this week (adorers whom I emailed), all hours were covered except two!

We must do everything we can with the talented parishioners and generous benefactors to make our school safe, but I must say I believe that prayer before the Blessed Sacrament here and at St. Mary's has the most significant impact regarding our safety.

In my daily afternoon mental prayer in the last week, I pray over these words of the St. Josemaria (whose relic is in the back of the Cathedral):

Results! Always looking for 'results'! You ask me for photographs, for facts and figures.

I won't send you what you ask, because (though I respect the opposite opinion), I would then think I had acted with a view to making good on earth, and where I want to make good is in heaven.

Making good in heaven seems like a lofty "dream." How can we – feeble and weak – make good in heaven when we're on earth? In my undergraduate studies (Accounting/Finance, Biology, and a minor in Economics) – for the most part I was not attending Sunday Mass nor was I therefore in sanctifying grace. It was intoxicating the truths I learned. Can an Accountant, Finance Officer, or Biologist become a canonized Saint? Yes!, when they do their work well and offer it up to God! When we're living in sanctifying grace everything not sinful can be offered to God as prayer and we sense being children of God, right there in our ordinary lives. As we enter into the ordinary life of the school year, which hopefully affects all of us, let's make our life on earth "good in heaven" by being open to the graces at Mass, Adoration, Confession, and our personal prayer lives directing us. I'll write from my workshop in Kenya on what our personal prayer life can include. Pray for my workshop - a delayed one that was originally to be in the Holy Land - I'll be praying for you!
