Father Armentrout's message . . . This upcoming week, the Church celebrates two important Marian feast days. The first is that of our Nation's Patroness- The Immaculate Conception. We honor Mary for her privileged place in our redemption. She, the spotless virgin, who gave birth to our King through her faithful response to God- "Let it be done unto me according to thy word." We ask her in this special season in which we anticipate the coming of Christ as an infant at Christmas to purify our lives and direct us always in the way of Holiness. Next Sunday is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It was our blessed mother who converted the hearts of entire tribes away from cruel sacrifice and the shedding of innocent blood. She is the 'Star of the New Evangelization' as John Paul II hailed her for her ability to convert an entire nation. One need only go to Mexico City for a brief moment to recognize the impact of our Lady's apparitions on an entire culture. Through her apparitions to a poor, humble man, the hearts of an entire nation were turned to God. Because of these two feasts and, since we cannot think of celebrating Christmas without considering the mother who gave birth to the Son of God, we call this season a Marian season. In Advent, we ask Mary to teach us to receive her Son into our hearts, just as she received Him into her own! St. John Paul II was profoundly aware of the Marian aspect of this season in which we anticipate the birth of our savior! I would encourage you to take the following words of John Paul II to prayer to help you enter more fully into this time of joyful anticipation.

May the Virgin Mary help us to open the doors of our hearts to Christ, Redeemer of man and of history; may she teach us to be humble, because God looks upon the lowly; may she enable us to grow in understanding the value of prayer, of inner silence, of listening to God's Word; may she spur us to seek God's will deeply and sincerely, even when this upsets our plans; may she encourage us while we wait for the Lord, sharing our time and energies with those in need. Mother of God, Virgin of expectation, grant that the God-who-comes will find us ready to receive the abundance of his mercy. May Mary Most Holy, "Woman of the Eucharist" and Virgin of Advent, prepare us all to joyfully welcome Christ's coming and to celebrate worthily his sacramental presence in the mystery of the Eucharist.
