A Message from Father Benjamin Fenlon

Merry Christmas dear Cathedral and St. Mary's, and may you have a very happy New Year.

With the New Year come a lot of new starts, fresh desires, and uncertainties.

One thing, however, is certain, and it is that none of us will be keeping our New Year's resolutions! Yay!

Year after year, we make these dreamy, impossible resolutions, that vanish once the emotion of the New Year is gone, and the daily schedule starts bearing down on us again.

However, I want to suggest a wonderful resolution that we can all keep: sign up for one hour of Adoration a week in the MIR House of Prayer or at Cathedral.

Adoration does not drain our strengths, nor does it require us to do bizarre or difficult things. It is an hour of silent prayer, reflection, in the loving presence of your God, who loves you and cares for you.

Winter is harsh. Why not let your loving God warm your heart? Our Lord Jesus Christ is waiting for you, day and night, in the Sacred Host, to reignite your faith, rekindle your hope, and set ablaze your love.

Adoration is a normal, default thing for all Catholics. Sometimes we forget that. But St. John Paul II spent countless hours in adoration whilst he was Pope. Pope Benedict celebrated the most solemn Eucharistic events in Rome, one even involving over 10,000 priests (I was there). Pope Francis has asked and asked us, again and again, to have one 24 hour period of Adoration in each parish, at least once a year.

I once heard a testimony of a religious sister, who found her vocation after a friend told her "If you want something new to happen, start doing new things".

This New Year, if you have never tried, or committed to, Adoration... please consider this invitation. Maybe it's time to start doing something new!
