Jesus, I Trust In You!

This is Divine Mercy Sunday, and as such, I think it is the perfect time to talk about trust. One of the most important revelations in the *Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska* concerns the role of trust. Jesus tells St. Faustina that the "graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is - trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive" (*Diary*, 1578).

Sunday's Gospel is one of my favorite accounts of the Apostles, doubting Thomas. As with all my favorite scriptures, this is one that hits home for me. Many times in my life, I have been just like Thomas wanting to see the wounds of Christ before I will believe. Yet Christ says, "Blessed are those who have believed WITHOUT seeing..." Why is an act of trust so significant to our spiritual life? It is because trust plays a key role in our relationship with God and others. Think about it. To trust someone means that you believe so much in the competency and goodness of another that you are willing to entrust yourself to that person.

Trust becomes a conduit that allows for the free communication of love between two people. Since trust is such a personal act, we can understand why Jesus tells St. Faustina that He gives so much importance to it in drawing graces from His merciful Heart. A lack of trust in Jesus is a type of rejection of His Person.

I recently watched the movie "A Hidden Life" about Bl. Franz Jägerstätter. He was a poor Austrian farmer who refused to sign an oath to serve Adolf Hitler during World War II. He knew in his heart what was happening was not right, and he refused to take part in it. Instead, he put all his trust in Jesus Christ. Ultimately this led to his imprisonment and even his death. Several times he was asked if he thought what he was doing would make a difference in the war. His jailers didn't understand that his motive wasn't to change the war; he was just trusting in Christ that what he was doing was God's will. This model of faith and trust begs that we ask ourselves if we are followers or admirers of Jesus. Are we willing to trust that his Word is truth, or like Thomas will we demand a sign, or worse yet, ignore it and sign an oath to the world? The choice will be ours to make, and it's one we should think about before it arrives at our doorstep.


