Message from Father Hansen. . . Happy Easter! The Lord is risen! Alleluia!!

It is almost hard to imagine what the risen Lord gave us last year about this time. You all watched the Easter Masses from home. The Mass of the Last Supper, the reading of the Passion and Stations... all from home. This year, this year of St. Joseph, we gather again in the Cathedral (most of us). I will get my second vaccine shot on April 8th (Easter Thursday). If you have not had a chance, I would recommend watching Bishop Johnston in an interview with Dr. Patrick Herrick regarding ethical consideration with the Covid Vaccine. The use of human means to give glory to God is probably one of the least accessed forms of prayer. St. Paul tells us to pray always. Making our work a prayer is not complicated – we do our work well and we offer it to God – but it is not easy. It takes time in meditation – time for God – first! In this case, it is the work of a Bishop and a family physician: Bishop Johnston and Dr. Herrick. You and I can offer even what seems to be the most ordinary things as sacrificial offerings to our Father, through the Son! And, that Son is risen. What St. Paul told the Colossians he could have told to those in St. Joseph: "Whatever you do, work at it with your whole being. Do it for the Lord rather than for men, since you know full well that you will receive an inheritance from him as your reward. Be slaves of Christ the Lord."

Maybe a consideration for this Easter, coming out of the year of pandemic, let us pray every day - stopping before the tabernacle or in Adoration if possible – and let us be conscious that our Lord was everything resurrected, offered to the Father, bringing the reign of Christ to all the nooks and crannies of St. Joseph!
