Message from Seminarian Pius . . .

Dear All.

Last week we heard of how Christ called his apostles. Friends, I have been pondering the profundity of the Apostles' resolve to abandon the security of their livelihoods, friends, family, and all they had ever known to follow a strange person with whom they had almost no familiarity. What thoughts may have transpired in their minds as they walked behind him? Walking through an airport tunnel to move to another continent, I, too, recall my own thoughts. Yet, something was special about this man, Jesus. This carpenter's son is not only a man, but he also is God. Did he look deep into their eyes when he asked them to follow him? Their gaze must have been fixated on the radiance of his being and their hearts burned with immense longing for him who they knew not.

This week, we hear of how Christ taught at the synagogue. The synagogue ruler had the prerogative of inviting someone from the congregation to speak. St. Mark points to Christ's divinity as God, saying, "the people were astonished at his teaching for he taught as one having authority and not as the scribes." Others would merely quote ancient prophets and teachers, but this time Christ assumes his rightful place and teaches as the ultimate Prophet and Teacher. He teaches in his own name. Oh, the power of God, such that the devil tremble! We, the children of this Great King, should see his might as our assurance, our solace, and thus have recourse to him. In 2020, the devil convulsed the world, shook it up, raged in mighty storms and noise. He still does. But he now knows the answer to his own question, "have you come to destroy us?" God has got this; God has got us.

In the simplicity of a quiet voice, Christ says to you and to me, "Come follow me". We may not know where he will lead us, just like the apostles did not. But billions of people across the globe know Christ today because of only twelve ordinary men. Think of that . . . a great multitude in heaven singing in joy and praise before His Majesty at this moment because of those twelve. St. Paul in the second reading urges us to have no anxieties. May that look in Christ's eyes, which prompted the apostles to leave everything and follow him, to also prompt us, and may we not harden our hearts if we hear his voice.


