"Another tragedy for one of our priests; Think of you and pray for you each day"; "Prayers for all priests today"; "Our prayers are with you and all priests"; "So sorry, Father.. praying for you and your fellow priests"; "I love you as a brother in Christ, a son, and a friend"; "We love you Fr..!". These are just a few of the many emails, texts messages, and voicemails I've received this week after the tragic passing of Fr. Evan Harkins from St. James and St. Patrick's.

I've known Father since coming to the Diocese; his family was one of the first to welcome me. I taught his younger siblings in a homeschool Co-op for a short time. Hearing and reading the words sent to me doesn't console Father's family, but the expressions of love, thanksgiving, and affection, along with tears, seem to me to be the best place to begin healing after someone seemingly takes their own life.

You and I might wonder; were those words shared enough before such a tragedy? Only God knows. I was comforted by Bishop Johnston's visit to St. James on Tuesday evening in his closing reference to one title of the Holy Spirit, the Consoler. Yes, we need the power of the Holy Spirit to go forward after such sad experiences of the fragility of life. We also can find solace in the teaching of the Church. In the Catechism we read:

2282 Grave psychological disturbances, anguish, or grave fear of hardship, suffering, or torture can diminish the responsibility of the one committing suicide.

2283 We should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives.

Let us pray for Fr. Harkins, his family, all priests, and all those close to us in a special way at this time. Let us tell others of our love and appreciation for them.
