Message from Deacon Joshua Fultz:

"If you wish, you can make me clean." - Mark 1:40

After joining the Church in 2005, one of the first ministries I worked with was the cold weather shelter inside the food kitchen in downtown St. Joe. Spending time with these men and hearing their stories was very eye opening for me. Every story was different, but each one shared a common theme of spiritual brokenness and shame.

In more recent years I have found myself working in ministries focused on spiritual healing. As it turns out, it's not just the homeless that suffer from this spiritual brokenness and shame. Many of us are carrying around wounds that are invisible to the naked eye and we do our best to make sure they stay that way. We swallow our pain and force it down into dark places we don't want to go, but that's not what God wants for us. He wants to heal us. He wants to make us clean. He wants to uncover those wounds and bring them into the light of his healing love.

This is why he gives us the sacraments of healing in anointing of the sick and reconciliation. Many times, I get asked by Catholics who have fallen away from the Church what it will take for them to come home. I always tell them that for the most part it's really easy. You just have to go to confession, admit your sins, and receive Christ's healing. Now, I know there can be other circumstances that need to be taken care of as well, but the Church in her wisdom has also given us clear teachings on how to bring everyone home, because she knows the will of the Father. The Church knows that God wants to heal each of us, just as we see Jesus heal the leper in this week's gospel passage.

If you or someone you love is lost and broken, please do not lose hope. You are the beloved sons and daughters of a loving father. Come receive his healing touch.

As a reminder, the following information from the USCCB includes fasting and abstinence requirements for Catholics.

"Ash Wednesday (February 14th) and Good Friday (March 29th) are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection."




