As an advertising and creative director, social media is a part of my daily job. I not only create it, but I also watch trends and look for new ways to reach out to the communities that use our services. Lately, the trends in social media have become much darker than in years past. The latest trend seems to be one of blind hatred and division. You might think it would all be in just one or two areas, like politics and the current pandemic, but I'm seeing it go even farther, by blindly attacking history, while at the same time repeating it.

Recently Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez pointed to the statue of St. Damien and declared it a symbol of white supremacy. Last month a statue of St. Junipero Serra was also pulled down as part of a protest, accusing him along with others, of being agents of racism. Just a brief look into history would show anyone that both of these men were far from racist. So why are they being attacked? The answer is blind hatred, acting out of pure emotion without any rational thought. Many of these "protestors" believe in their heart of hearts they are bringing justice to people who have long suffered at the hands of systemic racism. Yet, in their ignorance of history, they are only spreading the wildfire of hate and division with their destructive acts. I say many because, in these groups, there are individuals who merely seek to cause havoc. Their sole purpose is to steal, kill, and destroy. Does that sound familiar? It is precisely the way Jesus describes Satan, the father of lies. He comes to steal, kill, and destroy.

Don't be tempted to think that this is all on the coasts and doesn't affect us locally; that is a lie. Division and hatred are alive and well in the mid-west. From the "masks vs. no masks" fight to the "Novus Ordo vs. Latin Mass," division is in our community, and it creeps its way into our hearts. The problem with division is that it blurs the reality that there is room for all of us. God does not love only some of us; he loves ALL of us. We must make room for others in our hearts and not act out of a place of hatred. Are there things we need to change in our country, our city, our homes? YES. We are all sinners, and there are things we need to change, but striking out in hatred does not create change. If we want to create change, we must be vigilant about the messages we send out into the world. We also have to go to the extra effort to know precisely what values the groups we support represent. If we blindly support a message, we may unknowingly support hatred in disguise. It's up to us to meet hate with love, but not our love, the love of Christ.
