#### Message from Deacon Joshua Fultz . . . Learning to Embrace Joy

The days are ticking away, closing in on Christmas. Some people are busy shopping, planning the perfect meal or the perfect family pajama party, calling all the relatives, and trying to figure out who's coming over or who's staying home. Some people are worried, trying to find a job, waiting for unemployment to kick in, whether or not they can buy gifts, or even where they will find their next meal. Busy or worried, they are continually being bombarded by the message that they need to be happy. They are poked and prodded by questions like, "what's wrong?" or statements like "quit being a grinch." It's a constant barrage of noise that we've all become accustomed to, and the steady ingraining of the notion that we are all supposed to seek what this world labels as happiness. If we peel back that label, we find out that the product they are selling really is pleasure. Our world loves to peddle pleasure. It's the biggest and best-selling product it has — because it doesn't last. Like mice chasing cheese, we sniff out the things that will bring us a moment of happiness. Soon that moment fades, and we wander back into the maze of the world to find a little more. You can see it in the grimaces on all the faces wandering the aisles in stores.

This weekend marks the Third Sunday in Advent; Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice! This is the Sunday of *GREAT JOY*, but what does that mean? Isn't joy the same thing as happiness? The quick answer is no, they aren't the same, but they are related. Happiness can lead us to joy, but just like pleasure, happiness is fleeting. Joy, on the other hand, is sustainable no matter how you are feeling. Joy runs deeper than happiness; it pierces down into our souls. We experience joy when we achieve selflessness to the point of personal sacrifice. We feel joy when we are spiritually connected to God and people. Happiness is centered on the self, whereas joy is grounded in the idea that something is good for someone else. We have joy when we are acting towards the well-being of others. Even if we are immersed in suffering, this act of selfless giving will wash over us in the experience of joy. We see this perfected in Christ's gift to us on the cross. *Hebrews 12:2 "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross."* 

It's Christ's gift that has been my joy through many challenging moments I have experienced in my life. Without this joy, I'm not sure I could have stayed sane. It's the knowledge that I can unite my suffering to His that helps me to carry those crosses. In those moments, my heart lifts because I have hope — I know that I have a savior that, no matter what, loves me and wants to help me carry this burden. I can look into the world and see His mighty hands at work and have joy, knowing that those same hands will lift me up. I may not smile, but I do feel that joy.

Sadly, we live in a world that no longer knows how to embrace joy because it was never taught how. Instead, we were taught to seek happiness to numb our suffering. This puts us on the road to failure. Eventually, the pleasure fails to numb the pain, and we're left with only despair and no way to cope. We have to undo that brainwashing! It might mean that every day you have to remind yourself that there is hope in Jesus Christ. It reminds me of a song I sang at church as a kid. We have to put that "JOY, JOY, JOY DOWN IN OUR HEARTS! DOWN IN OUR HEARTS! DOWN IN OUR HEARTS!" That joy is found in a manger; it's found on the cross, and ultimately, it's found on the altar in the hands of our priests as they says, "Behold! The Lamb of God! Who takes away the sins of the world!" Sometimes, embracing joy means pressing that cross we're carrying right into the side of our face — knowing that Jesus is right there beside us, helping to carry the load.
