Message from Father Hansen . . .

Today, with the Baptism of the Lord, the Church concludes the Christmas Season! Seems like just yesterday we were getting out the Advent wreaths... Merry Christmas!

Can you believe it? Lent begins on February 17th this year (Ash Wednesday). This short time of Ordinary Time, between Christmas and Lent (and between Pentecost and the First Sunday of Advent) in the year of St. Joseph, should have an extraordinary meaning. St. Joseph was an ordinary man who received an extraordinary calling. You might say that his leading Jesus as a boy in ordinary things became extra ordinary. As we participate in this year set aside by Pope Francis, let us be mindful of the dignity of all work. We do not necessarily need a bigger house or to have this or that to be happy. We need to offer up our ordinary work/life as sacrifices pleasing to God our Father, through Jesus, in the Holy Spirit; that will make us really happy!
