Message from Father Hansen . . . Happy Epiphany Sunday!! I continue my best wishes to you in this Christmas Season!

There is a rich tradition to have homes Blessed by one of the parish priests in our Faith. There is also a tradition to have the head of the home Bless the home. This year, Blessed chalk will be provided at all Masses for those wishing to do the Blessing with chalk and I invite any of you to let Fr. Leete or me know if you'd like us to Bless you home. My days of priesthood have seen many people liking me to Bless the home one time and some use the Blessed chalk in other years.

<u>The Chalking of the Doors</u>: This year, we invite you to take part in a centuries-old tradition of "chalking the door" to celebrate the Epiphany, the day that marks the arrival of the magi, to the place where Jesus was born! We will be equipping you with the prayer instructions, blessed chalk and holy water located in the west vestibule by the holy water tank.

"Chalking the door" is a sign and symbol of asking God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit your home throughout the coming year. In Exodus, the Israelites marked their doors with blood so that the Lord would pass over their homes; but in this service, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign that we have invited God's presence and blessing into our homes.

In Deuteronomy 6:9, God tells the people of Israel: "These words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house... You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." Chalking the door is a tangible way to honor God in our lives.

Write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 21

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi - Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar -who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "21" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is a request that Christ bless those homes so marked and that he stay with those who dwell within them throughout the entire year.

This prayer can be done by the Father or Mother or other head of household:

"May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. Amen.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Saviour. Amen.

Loving God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and abiding in your will. We ask this through Christ our Saviour. Amen. "For an alternative blessing, please see: https://onepeterfive.com/the-chalking-of-the-doors-an-epiphany-tradition-explained/
