Mark Sappington's Message . . .

Faithful People of St. Joseph,

My name is Mark Sappington and I've had the privilege of coming up to the Cathedral of St. Joseph many times over the past couple of years. I love St. Joseph and narrowly missed on purchasing a home up there! Maybe someday!!

Because of my work with young people discerning vocations (to the priesthood, married life, etc.) Fr. Hansen offered me the opportunity to write to you all to share my story and my work a bit - I jumped at the chance! Thank you for taking a moment to read this bulletin article.

So a bit about myself...I'm the second of six children, a son to Scott and Mary Sappington. I grew up in Peculiar, MO. I've got a brother, Paul Sappington, who you may see on some of the Seminarian Posters. He is less than two years away from being ordained a Priest for the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. He was an electrical engineer working for Burns and McDonnell, then he began to do mental prayer (a silent conversation with God for 20min or so, every day) and he felt the call to the seminary, AND answered it! Please pray for him.

I myself heard the call of the Lord back in 2014, to give up a life of sin and self-centeredness (still working on this!!). I didn't think God was calling me to the seminary – frankly, I didn't think of anything. I was a professional baseball player for the Los Angeles Angels, living a life centered around myself. I had all of the trappings of the world --- some money, a lifestyle of pleasure, fame, you name it. It turned my soul black and after experiencing some large scale failure (giving up homeruns in front of thousands of people to lose games, a broken relationship, a lack of fulfillment), I began to wonder what life was all about. In my first 24 years, I'd never really thought about it. So at the guidance of a dear friend, I got crazy and set a timer. For 20 minutes a day for 132 out of 133 days, I sat in silence for those 20 minutes trying to talk to God. Everything changed.

What blossomed in that time was a personal relationship with Jesus. I found that He wanted to speak to me – that He had been speaking to me – but that I needed to get quiet so I could listen! This led to me diving into this "call" that the Lord had for me, and I realized He wanted me to stop living for myself and to start living for others. I could share so much more about my life (and I'd love to – email me!), meeting Mike Trout at a urinal, running into Albert Pujols in the locker room, you name it. But what I want you to know is that during this time I had someone help me learn how to pray, and someone who helped me realize that if I was going to get to know God I had to spend time listening!

So what is my point of all these words? I want to help anyone and everyone, especially young men, find their calling. If you have a son who is curious about the seminary or the priesthood I'd love to be a resource and a friend as he navigates that potential call.

We are all called to be Saints!! St. Joseph is a special place for that, as he was entrusted by God to be the Foster-Father of Jesus. It's no wonder that St. Joseph is fertile ground for vocations. Off the top of my head I can name Fr. Mattingly, Fr. Kreidler, Dcn. Garrett King, amongst others who have been called out of St. Joseph and into the Holy Priesthood. There are many more I am sure!

Please increase your prayers and the intensity of your knocking on the Lord's door! "Ask the Lord of the Harvest to send more laborers out into the vineyard". If you have any questions at all about vocations, discernment, how to build a daily prayer life, shoot me an email at sappington@olgckc.org. I've got a special heart for people who are hungry to pursue the Lord and his plan for their life. There are over 7,000,000,000 different vocations — a unique call from the Lord for every one of His children! I'd love to help you figure that out. Thanks again for taking the time to read this little column. Please pray for me! I need your prayers! I hope to speak with some of you soon...struggle well!!

We Need You!

As an update to the St. Joseph Catholic Schools project, the Vitality in Catholic Education Visioning committee has evolved into an Implementation Committee to put in place their recommendations, including establishing a new organizational structure -St. Joseph Catholic School Partnership (SJCSP).

This new organization will be overseen by a school board of limited jurisdiction acting under the administrative jurisdiction of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph School Office.

The Board is responsible for the general operations of the Partnership to develop, formulate, and enact policies that guide the general operations of the new organization, including areas of Strategic Planning, Marketing and Public Relations, Development and Fundraising, Financial Review, and Professional Development of Principals and Teachers.

The Board is to consist of thirteen (13) voting members, including six (6) Ex Officio and seven (7) at large members selected from the St Joseph Community.

<u>Ex-Officio Members</u> of the Board shall consist of The Diocesan Superintendent of Catholic Schools, a Pastor appointed by the Bishop, the four Presidents of the Advisory Board for each participating K-8 schools and Bishop LeBlond High School.

<u>At large Members</u> consists of seven (7) individuals, candidates from the St Joseph community approved by the Bishop.

Members of the Partnership Board are intended to be diverse and competent by representing the St. Joseph Catholic Community in terms of socio-economic, ethnicity, and occupations (legal, financial, operations, education, marketing, fundraising, etc.). The majority will be practicing Catholics, representing different parishes, include Catholic school alumni, and committed to long term viability of our school system.

At large board members will serve three (3) year terms. Candidates for the board must be willing and able to serve, committed to attending monthly meetings and being active on one or subcommittees (which also meet monthly). Candidates should be good listeners, offer constructive input, handle conflicts of interest, while maintaining confidentiality as required.

We expect to have the newly appointed Board selected and in place by mid-December.
