Deacon Joshua Fultz... Can perspective change suffering?

I have often heard the phrase "offer it up" attached to suffering. Some folks hand it out like a cure-all solution for almost every problem. Often it reminds me of how my grandmother did the same thing with Vick's VapoRub. A little dab (more like giant glob) would seem to cure everything from a cold to the stomach flu. I have to admit that I am even guilty of handing out that phrase, but I'm starting to rethink it.

Just this past week, I found out that a good friend had two of his teenage children try to commit suicide in the past six months. They were each dealing with different types of suffering. One has Crohn's disease and deals with constant pain, the other struggles with constant depression. Both had three friends commit suicide within the past year. Merely saying "offer it up" can't help this kind of suffering; in fact, it can almost feel like a slap in the face to the person who is suffering.

We have to change our understanding of what it truly means to "offer it up." I propose we look at suffering from a new perspective. Instead, what if we entered into the pain. Christ invites us to join in his passion and unite our suffering with his. Many saints have endured continuous pain, but they did it from the perspective of being united with Christ on his journey to Golgotha. It's easy to become isolated in our pain. The devil likes to isolate us in darkness so he can convince us to start believing his lies. The lie that our suffering is our fault, that we're too weak to bear it, that no one can love us in our pain, or worse yet, that it would just be better if we were dead. These lies open doors to more lies, and soon all sorts of demons are whispering in our ears, and we begin to be lieve the lies. Instead, we need to look deep into our pain like the saints did and see that Christ can make us strong in our weakness. When we see our suffering as having a redemptive purpose, our perspective can start to change, even though our suffering may remain. We lean into the pain and make it something new, an inner fire burning with the love of Christ.

Still, there is another perspective we should consider: that of Simon of Cyrene. Those of us who are not suffering may be called to take on Simon's role. It will be our job to help someone bear that cross, all the way up to Calvary. That is not an easy role to adopt; even Simon was forced into it. It's easier to say, "offer it up." It's much harder to help carry the burden of someone else's pain. Listening and offering empathy can be a soothing balm to the open sores left by the whips of suffering. It's in these moments we can be the light of Christ in the darkest of situations.

"...he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me. Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians 12: 9-10


