Holy Spirit, inspire us as we discern ways to make the priorities of the Mutually Shared Vision our own. Increase in us a desire to live our baptismal call, to be salt and light in the world, and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in our daily lives. A Carmelite priest (Fr. No one can compel us to *feel* one way or another about our Divine filiation, because our status as adopted children does not depend upon something as mutable as our moods and feelings. But to act in faith according to this deepest truth about ourselves brings us an experiential conviction that God is "our Father, and very much our Father, ... who is both near us and in heaven." (Cf. *The Way*, 267.)
