On Thursday early morning a bus is leaving from St. Joseph for Washington, D.C., for the annual Pro-Life March; I'm scheduled to be on the bus. This will be my 18th trip to our nation's capital for the March. Please pray for me; this time we'll have no rest in Washington; just a bus ride out, the March, and a bus ride back!

What a gift we have in the Church's teaching on Life. Bishop Johnston quoted Pope St. John Paul II in his letter to us priests on January 3rd, it read: "...a great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer."

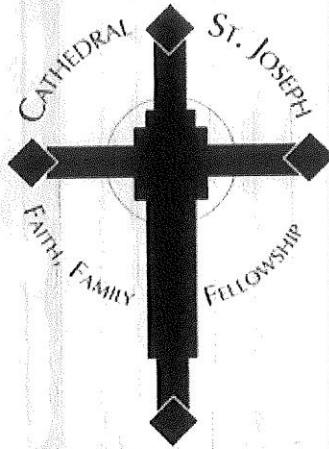

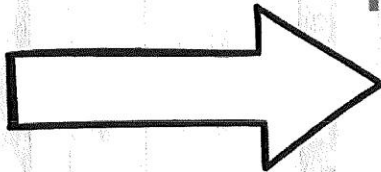
